4. Divide, then express your answer in the 3 different forms indicated.

$$\begin{aligned} 6 \overline{) 219} &= \square \text{ r } \square \\ &= \square. \\ &= \square \frac{\square}{\square} \end{aligned}$$

5. Divide, then express your answer in the 3 different forms indicated.

$$21 \overline{)432} = \boxed{} \text{ r } \boxed{}$$

(Note: in the decimal form, round your answer to three decimal places.)

13. Divide: $\frac{0.45}{2.2} =$ Give your answer in the exact form (as a repeating decimal) and rounded to five decimal places. Also, write an equivalent fraction in lowest terms.

14. Convert the fraction $\frac{3}{7}$ to a repeating decimal. (Hint: you will have to carry the division out several places before it starts to repeat!)

15. Which is larger: $\frac{5}{16}$ or $\frac{8}{23}$? (Hint: convert both fractions to decimals.)

16. You have \$25.82. What is the maximum amount of money you could give to each of your 6 friends if each must have the same amount? How much would you have left?

Answers:

1. $60 \overline{) 43} = \frac{\boxed{43}}{\boxed{60}}$

2. If $7 \times 5 = 35$, then $35 \div 7 = 5$ or $35 \div 5 = 7$

3. 24

4. = 36 r 3

$$= 36.5 = 36\frac{1}{2}$$

("r" means "remainder")

5. = 20 r 12

$$= 20.571 = 20\frac{4}{7}$$

6. = 118 r 28

$$= 118.\overline{38}$$

$$= 118\frac{7}{18}$$

7. 3.8

8. 5.599

9. 0.00276

10. 11.2

11. 6.85

12. 13,100

13. $.20\overline{45} = .20455$

14. $\frac{3}{7} = \overline{.428571}$

15. $\frac{8}{23} > \frac{5}{16}$

16. \$4.30 with \$0.02 (2 cents) left

$$= \frac{9}{44}$$

5.
$$21 \overline{)432} \rightarrow 21 \overline{)432} \begin{array}{r} -42 \\ \hline 12 \end{array}$$
 note: because $12 < 21$, we put a "0" in the quotient. $\rightarrow = \boxed{20 \text{ r } 12}$

to get the decimal:
continue by adding zeros after decimal in dividend as needed.

$$21 \overline{)432.0} \begin{array}{r} -42 \\ \hline 12 \\ -0 \\ \hline 120 \\ -105 \\ \hline 15 \end{array} \rightarrow 21 \overline{)432.0} \begin{array}{r} -42 \\ \hline 12 \\ -0 \\ \hline 120 \\ -105 \\ \hline 15 \end{array}$$

$$21 \overline{)432.00} \begin{array}{r} -42 \\ \hline 12 \\ -0 \\ \hline 120 \\ -105 \\ \hline 150 \\ -147 \\ \hline 3 \end{array}$$

continue, we want an answer correct to 3 decimal places.

$$21 \overline{)432.0000} \begin{array}{r} -42 \\ \hline 12 \\ -0 \\ \hline 120 \\ -105 \\ \hline 150 \\ -147 \\ \hline 30 \\ -21 \\ \hline 90 \\ 84 \\ \hline 6 \end{array}$$

so, $432 \div 21 = 20.5714 \dots$ less than 5. Leave 2nd decimal place as is.

$\approx \boxed{20.571}$ (note: \approx means "is approximately equal to")

To get the mixed number, recall $21 \overline{)432} = 20 \text{ r } 12$
 $= 20 \frac{12}{21}$ (reduce fraction)
 $= \boxed{20 \frac{4}{7}}$

$$6. \quad 72 \overline{)8524} \rightarrow 72 \overline{)8524} \begin{array}{r} 1 \\ -72 \\ \hline 132 \end{array} \rightarrow 72 \overline{)8524} \begin{array}{r} 11 \\ -72 \\ \hline 132 \\ -72 \\ \hline 604 \end{array} \rightarrow 72 \overline{)8524} \begin{array}{r} 118 \\ -72 \\ \hline 132 \\ -72 \\ \hline 604 \\ -576 \\ \hline 28 \end{array}$$

$$\frac{8524}{72} = \boxed{118 \text{ r } 28}$$

decimal: $72 \overline{)8524.0} \rightarrow 72 \overline{)8524.000}$

$$\begin{array}{r} 118.3 \\ -72 \\ \hline 132 \\ -72 \\ \hline 604 \\ -576 \\ \hline 280 \\ -216 \\ \hline 64 \end{array} \quad \begin{array}{r} 118.388 \\ -72 \\ \hline 132 \\ -72 \\ \hline 604 \\ -576 \\ \hline 280 \\ 216 \\ \hline 640 \\ -576 \\ \hline 640 \end{array}$$

$$= \boxed{118.\overline{38}}$$

remainder is repeating,
so we can stop division.
The "8" in the quotient
will repeat.

mixed number $72 \overline{)8524} = 118 \text{ r } 28 = 118 \frac{28}{72}$

$$\frac{28}{72} = \frac{4.7}{4.18} = \frac{7}{18}$$

$$= \boxed{118 \frac{7}{18}}$$

$$7. \quad 2.4 \overline{)9.12} \rightarrow 24 \overline{)91.2} \rightarrow 24 \overline{)91.2} \begin{array}{r} 3. \\ -72 \\ \hline 192 \end{array} \rightarrow 24 \overline{)91.2} \begin{array}{r} 3.8 \\ -72 \\ \hline 192 \\ -192 \\ \hline 0 \end{array}$$

so, $\frac{9.12}{2.4} = \boxed{3.8}$

$$8. \quad 2.84 \overline{)15.9} \rightarrow 2.84 \overline{)15.90} \rightarrow 284 \overline{)1590} \rightarrow$$

$$\begin{array}{r} 5.6 \\ 284 \overline{)1590.0} \\ \underline{-1420} \\ 1700 \\ \underline{-1704} \\ \end{array}$$

note: when we "guess" what digit will go into the quotient line, we are estimating, in this case, how many times

284 goes into 1700. I guessed 6 times, but $6 \times 284 = 1704$ which is too big. Now I go back and correct.

$$\begin{array}{r} 5.5985 \\ 284 \overline{)1590.0000} \\ \underline{-1420} \\ 1700 \\ \underline{-1420} \\ 2800 \\ \underline{-2556} \\ 2440 \\ \underline{-2272} \\ 1680 \\ \underline{-1420} \\ 260 \end{array}$$

We need our answer correct to 3 decimal places, so we must carry the division out to 4 decimal places to round correctly.

$$5.5985 \dots \approx \boxed{5.599}$$

note: if we were asked for the quotient correct to 2 decimal places, $5.5985 \approx 5.60$

$$9. \quad \frac{.01932}{7} = 7 \overline{)0.01932} \rightarrow 7 \overline{).00276}$$

first non-zero digit will be placed over the 9.

$$\begin{array}{r} .00276 \\ 7 \overline{).01932} \\ \underline{-014} \\ 53 \\ \underline{-49} \\ 42 \end{array}$$

$$\boxed{.00276}$$

$$10. \quad \frac{4.48 \times 10}{.4 \times 10} = \frac{44.8}{4} = 4 \overline{)44.8} = 4 \overline{)44.8}$$

$$\begin{array}{r} 11.2 \\ 4 \overline{)44.8} \\ \underline{-4} \\ 04 \\ \underline{-4} \\ 08 \\ \underline{-8} \\ 0 \end{array}$$

$$= \boxed{11.2}$$

$$11. 5.48 \div 0.8 = \overset{6.8}{8} \overline{)54.8} = 8 \overline{)54.8} = 8 \overline{)54.8}$$

continuing,

$$\begin{array}{r} 6.85 \\ 8 \overline{)54.80} \\ \underline{-48} \\ 68 \\ \underline{-64} \\ 40 \\ \underline{40} \\ 0 \end{array}$$

$$5.48 \div 0.8 = \boxed{6.85}$$

$$12. \frac{524}{.04} = .04 \overline{)524} = .04 \overline{)524.00} = 4 \overline{)52400.}$$

$$= \boxed{13,100}$$

$$\begin{array}{r} 13100 \\ 4 \overline{)52400} \\ \underline{-4} \\ 12 \\ \underline{-12} \\ 00 \\ \underline{-0} \\ 000 \end{array}$$

$$13. \frac{.45}{2.2} = 2.2 \overline{).45} = 22 \overline{)4.5} = 22 \overline{)4.500}$$

continue dividing because digits in quotient aren't repeating yet.

$$\begin{array}{r} 204545 \\ 22 \overline{)4.500000} \\ \underline{-44} \\ 10 \\ \underline{-0} \\ 100 \\ \underline{-88} \\ 120 \\ \underline{110} \\ 100 \\ \underline{88} \\ 120 \\ \underline{110} \\ 10 \end{array}$$

digits will start to repeat.

$$\begin{array}{r} 204 \\ 22 \overline{)4.500} \\ \underline{-44} \\ 10 \\ \underline{-0} \\ 100 \\ \underline{-88} \\ 12 \end{array}$$

$$\frac{.45}{2.2} = .204545 \dots$$

$$= .2045$$

$$\approx .20454545 \dots$$

round up

$$\approx \boxed{.20455}$$

as a fraction, $\frac{.45}{2.2} \times \frac{100}{100} = \frac{45}{220} = \frac{9}{44} = \boxed{\frac{9}{44}}$

14. $\frac{3}{7} =$

$$\begin{array}{r}
 .4285714 \\
 7 \overline{) 3.0000000} \\
 \underline{-28} \\
 20 \\
 \underline{-14} \\
 60 \\
 \underline{-56} \\
 40 \\
 \underline{-35} \\
 50 \\
 \underline{-49} \\
 10 \\
 \underline{-7} \\
 30 \\
 \underline{-28} \\
 2
 \end{array}$$

In longer division problems like this, it is especially important to keep columns straight.

} the remainders have begun to repeat

$$\begin{aligned}
 \frac{3}{7} &= .428571428571\dots \\
 &= \overline{.428571}
 \end{aligned}$$

15. $\frac{5}{16} =$ $16 \overline{) 5.00}$ \leftarrow $\frac{8}{23} =$ $23 \overline{) 8.00}$

$$\begin{array}{r}
 .31 \\
 16 \overline{) 5.00} \\
 \underline{-48} \\
 20 \\
 \underline{-16} \\
 4
 \end{array}
 \qquad
 \begin{array}{r}
 .34 \\
 23 \overline{) 8.00} \\
 \underline{-69} \\
 110 \\
 \underline{-92} \\
 18
 \end{array}$$

No need to continue dividing. We can see that $.34\dots > .31\dots$

$$\text{so } \frac{8}{23} > \frac{5}{16}$$

16. $\$25.82 \div 6 = 6 \overline{) 25.82} = 6 \overline{) 4.30}$

$$\begin{array}{r}
 4.30 \\
 6 \overline{) 25.82} \\
 \underline{-24} \\
 18 \\
 \underline{-18} \\
 .02 \leftarrow \text{left over}
 \end{array}$$

Stop at 2 decimal places, since this is money. You could give up to \$4.30 to each of your 6 friends with 2¢ (\$0.02) left over.
