

# ALL PREREQUISITE COURSEWORK (INCLUDING CNA COURSE) MUST BE COMPLETED BY DEADLINE DATE

The Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program at College of DuPage has been approved by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation/Board of Nursing and the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) and received reaccreditation in 2023 by The Higher Learning Commission – North Central Association. The ADN program has been awarded continuing accreditation through the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), 3390 Peachtree Road NE, Suite 1400, Atlanta, GA 30326, phone (404) 975-5000, <a href="https://www.acenursing.org">https://www.acenursing.org</a>.

Note: Please see specific program registration or admission packets for detailed information on when to begin completing health requirements, drug tests, CPR, criminal background checks and proof of insurance submission. Timing varies depending upon either entrance to or participation in the clinical component of a given program. Funds paid to Edward Corporate Health or to a personal health care provider/ source, Castle Branch, insurance companies, and funds used towards CPR completion are not eligible for any sort of refund from College of DuPage if the required course(s) are not successfully completed. You will NOT begin your health requirements until accepted into the program and you will receive further instructions.

Students are not accepted into this program until they receive an official acceptance letter from the Nursing Department.

# **Application cycle timeline for Spring 2026 Admission**

- Online applications for new students\* must be submitted by November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all materials (supporting documents and transcripts) have been completed and received by the designated office, by the application deadline date.
- Within 4-6 weeks Letters will be emailed to students @dupage.edu e-mail address regarding admission decisions.
- There will be 2 mandatory orientation days for those accepted into the program, which will occur prior to the start on the program. You will also receive instructions on registering for Nursing courses at orientation.

## **Admission Criteria**

Students interested in the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program will need to complete <u>all</u> of the following steps to be considered for admission.


NOTE: Admission Committees for all Health Science programs has the right to deny admission to any applicant that they feel is unable to fulfill these essential functions as described.

- Step 1\_\_\_\_\_ View the mandatory Associate Degree Nursing Advising Session within the application cycle and between 11/17/2024 and 11/17/2025. It is required that an applicant view an advising session within a 12-month period prior to the application deadline.
- Step 2 \_\_\_\_ If you have not been admitted to College of DuPage, please complete the non-refundable \$20 College of DuPage General Admissions Application online. This application is for general admissions to College of DuPage only; it is not an application to the Health Sciences Selective Enrollment Associate Degree Nursing program.
- Step 3 \_\_\_\_ To ensure that all of your eligible credits are evaluated towards the admission requirements, turn in ALL official Transcripts from institutions that you have attended. Immediately:
  - a) Submit your official transcript(s) to College of DuPage, Office of Student Records. **If College of DuPage** is the only institution you have attended, you do not need to request official transcripts.
  - b) Verify receipt of your transcript(s). Login to your myACCESS account, click on myACCESS for Students', then select 'My Profile'. The receipt status of your transcript will be listed under 'Transcript Institutions'.

Step 4 \_\_\_\_ Complete the non-refundable \$50 <u>Health Career Selective Enrollment Program Application</u> online by logging into the student portal at <a href="https://inside.cod.edu">https://inside.cod.edu</a>



Once the application is submitted, you <u>may not</u> change the term or program. If you do not have a credit card, you can purchase a prepaid credit card from your local retailer

Step 5 \_\_\_\_\_ Complete the <u>College of DuPage Residency Verification form</u> and provide a proof of residency to the Office of Student Registration Services by emailing to <u>registration@cod.edu</u> by the program application deadline date. You **MUST** send from your **@dupage.edu** e-mail address.

- Note:
  - a) If this residency requirement has not been submitted to Registration by the program application deadline date, you will not be considered for admission
  - b) Separate Residency Verification Forms must be submitted for each program application.

Step 6 \_\_\_\_\_ Complete academic coursework by the admission deadline. In order to qualify for the Associate Degree in Nursing Program the applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher in required prerequisite and general education coursework (A-D below) for the Associates degree in Nursing. Admissions will continue to review applicants until all seats have been filled. Admission is not

guaranteed and all admission criteria will need to be met.

- A. ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY: Anatomy and Physiology 1551/1571 and 1552/1572 or equivalent with a grade of "C" or better. Both courses must be completed between November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025, for Spring 2026 admission.
- **B. MICROBIOLOGY:** MICRO 1420 or equivalent with a grade of "C" or better
- **C. MATH**: MATH 1102\*, or higher with a grade of "C" or better with the exception of Math 1104, 1120 and 1340.

Recommended: Completion of an approved statistics course is recommended if your intentions are to continue your education for a BSN or MSN, i.e. MATH 1635; PSYCH 2280, SOCIO- 2205.

- **D.** Taking the courses below may help to increase your GPA, but are <u>not</u> required for admission to the program. Must have a grade of 'C' or higher. While these are not required for admission, they are required for the degree (see Program Map: Nursing on page 11)
  - a. Psychology 1100
  - b. English 1101
  - c. Psychology 2237
  - d. Speech 1100 or 1120
  - e. Humanities/Fine Arts
    - Recommended to take PHILO 1110. This will meet both Humanities & Global Multicultural/Contemp Life Skills requirement

Step 7	Take the Elsevier/Evolve Admission Assessment HESI (A2) exam. Testing information can be obtained at the College of DuPage Testing Center under Health Program Testing. Tests are scheduled by appointment only. The Elsevier/Evolve Admission Assessment (A2) exam must be taken at the College of DuPage Testing Office (BIC 2A06).* Exam must be completed by the admissions deadline date. You must take your exam within 30 days of receiving your payment link from Academic Testing. To verify that your results show in your student record, please log in to your myACCESS account; scores are available under 'Test Summary'. Please allow 3-5 business days for results to be posted to your student record from the date of the exam. If your results are not showing in your student records, please contact the Testing Office at testing@cod.edu or (630) 942-2401.  Applicants must achieve a cumulative score of 75%. A minimum score of 65% in HESI subject areas of Vocabulary, Reading, and Math is required. A minimum score of 70% in the HESI subject area of Anatomy & Physiology is required. All scores must be achieved in a single test. This admission HESI test must be taken within 2 years of the application deadline. The test can be taken once every 30 days (30-days begins with the date after you took the exam); for a total of 3 attempts in one calendar year (January 1 – December 31 current year).
Step 8	Proof of completion of an approved Illinois Department of Public Health Certified Nursing Assistant

Proof of completion of an approved Illinois Department of Public Health Certified Nursing Assistant Program. Approved programs can be found on the Nurse Aide Testing website. This documented proof can be provided by ensuring you are registered and certified on the IDPH Healthcare Worker registry

OR if you are not listed in the registry, you must submit a transcript or certificate showing proof of Certified Nursing Assistant program completion. Your Certified Nursing Assistant certificate can be submitted to <a href="mailto:hsadmissions@cod.edu">hsadmissions@cod.edu</a>.

# **Program Admission Preference**

Each program with out-of-district clinical sites (see list of participating programs below) may admit a maximum of 20% of out-of-district applicants to the program, based on merit. The 20% maximum policy would only apply to out-of-district applicants who do <u>not</u> have access to a particular program in the <u>community college district in which they reside</u>. Students coming from districts with a particular program within their district would only be considered if there were open seats after all qualified candidates from in-district and out-of-district without programs were accepted.

If there are insufficient numbers of qualified in-district applicants, the maximum percentage of out-of-district students accepted can be exceeded until the program achieves full enrollment, with the approval of the Dean of Nursing & Health Sciences.

# **Priority for Admission**

- a. In-District applicants
- b. Out-of-District who are part of the <u>CAREER Consortium Agreement</u> (meaning your residing community college does not offer the particular program in which you are applying)
- c. Out-of-District applicants working full-time in-district (proof of in-district employment will be required each semester)
- d. Out-of-District applicants (who are not part of the CAREER Consortium Agreement) including those students with a joint or chargeback agreement and International students

## **Additional Information**

- Courses satisfied by degree, proficiency and by national examination will not be used in the merit evaluation grade point average calculation
- Courses with a P (Pass) or S (Satisfaction) will not be accepted

## NOTE:

New students officially accepted into the Associate Degree in Nursing Program will receive an acceptance letter that will provide you with additional details.

Requests for admission are **not** automatically carried over to the following cycle. Applicants not accepted for the cycle in which they originally applied are asked to pay the \$50 non-refundable Health Career application fee and submit any/all supporting documents as listed on the Admissions Checklist of the Application Packet requirements (if applicable).

# **Nursing Transfer Students**

# (Students NOT previously enrolled in the College of DuPage ADN Program)

- 1. Student must complete Admissions Criteria steps 2 8 (pg. 2-4)
- 2. Student must submit all nursing course syllabi to the Nursing Department to <u>directorofnursing@cod.edu</u> for review before applying.
- 3. Student must submit a letter from the Director of Nursing at their college/university of attendance that states: "The student is eligible for readmission without the need for remedial measures and the student left the nursing program in good standing" to the <a href="mailto:directorofnursing@cod.edu">directorofnursing@cod.edu</a>. This letter is required as part of the admission process prior to the deadline date.
- 4. Student must meet with the Director of Nursing for an individual advising session after steps 1-3 are completed. Please e-mail directorofnursing@cod.edu to schedule an appointment.
- 5. Student will be assessed on a case-by-case basis after a review of completed nursing transcripts have been completed by the Director of Nursing. Students who have failed out of other Associate degree or Bachelor degree nursing programs are **not eligible** for advanced placement.

#### NOTE:

There is no option for LPN transition students to be considered for Advanced Placement.

"All application documents delivered to the College of DuPage pertaining to a health sciences admissions file become the property of the College of DuPage and will not be returned to applicants. # **Tips/Hints/Clues/Necessary Information**

- Make sure your name and contact information, including email and postal addresses are current and correct in myACCESS.
- Official name changes should be processed through the Office of Student Records (SRC 2150).
- Official address changes should be processed through Student Registration Services (SSC 2221).
- You MUST also notify the Health Science Admissions Office via email <a href="mailto:hsadmissions@cod.edu">hsadmissions@cod.edu</a> of any changes made to your personal information (name, mailing address, email address, etc.) after you have submitted your ADN program application.
- All prospective nursing students are strongly encouraged to enroll in READ-0471 Study Skills Seminar or HLTHS 1110 Medical Terminology; or, go to College of DuPage Learning Commons to assist you in your reading comprehension, math and verbal skills.

Failure to inform appropriate departments of name changes and contact information may result in not getting time sensitive information related to your admission decision.

# **Nursing Essential Functions**

If the ability to perform these essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations result in the inability to meet identified student learning outcomes, the student may be at risk of not successfully completing the course and/or program.

## **MOTOR CAPABILITY:**

- 1. Move from room to room and maneuver in small spaces
- 2. Squat, crawl, bend/stoop, reach above shoulder level, use standing balance, and climb stairs
- 3. Lift and carry up to 50 lbs., and exert up to 100 lbs. force or push/pull
- 4. Use hands repetitively; use manual dexterity; sufficient fine motor function
- 5. Must be able to walk and stand for extended periods of time
- 6. Perform CPR
- 7. Travel to and from academic and clinical sites

## **SENSORY CAPABILITY:**

- 1. Coordinate verbal and manual instruction
- 2. Auditory ability sufficient to hear verbal communication from clients and members of the health team; includes ability to respond to emergency signals
- 3. Discern soft sounds, such as those associated with taking a blood pressure
- 4. Visual acuity to acquire information from documents such as charts
- 5. Comfortable working in close physical proximity to patient

#### **COMMUNICATION ABILITY:**

- 1. Communicate effectively in English with patients, families, and other health care providers, both verbally and in writing
- 2. Effectively adapt communication for intended audience
- 3. Interact; establish rapport with individuals, families, and groups from a variety of social, emotional, cultural and intellectual backgrounds
- 4. Assume the role of a health care team member
- 5. Function effectively under supervision
- 6. Sufficient command of the English language in order to read and retrieve information from lectures, textbooks, as well as understand medical terminology
- 7. Skills include computer literacy

## **PROBLEM SOLVING ABILITY:**

- 1. Function effectively under stress
- 2. Respond appropriately to emergencies
- 3. Adhere to infection control procedures
- 4. Demonstrate problem-solving skills in patient care (measure, calculate, reason, prioritize, and synthesize data)
- 5. Use sound judgment and safety precautions
- 6. Address problems or questions to the appropriate persons at the appropriate time
- 7. Organize and prioritize job tasks

# Elsevier/Evolve Admission Assessment (A2) Exam Information SCHEDULE AND REGISTRATION INFORMATION CAN BE LOCATED AT:

The Admission Assessment Exam consists of a number of exams. The exams used as a part of the Associate Degree Nursing Program admission are noted below. Also noted is the number of questions per exam, and the estimated testing time. A total of 4 hours is allowed for the exam.

Individual scores are provided for each exam. Scores are reported in percent of answers correct. A composite score is also provided for the required academic tests of: **Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge, Math, and Anatomy and Physiology**. Applicants must achieve a cumulative score of 75%. A minimum score of 65% in HESI subject areas of Vocabulary, Reading, and Math is required. A minimum score of 70% in the HESI subject area of Anatomy & Physiology is required. All scores must be achieved in a single test. This admission HESI test must be taken within 2 years of the application deadline. The test can be taken once every 30 days (30-days begins with the date after you took the exam); for a total of 3 attempts in one calendar year (January 1 – December 31 current year).

#### **English language:**

- **Reading Comprehension** Provides reading scenarios in order to measure reading comprehension, identifying the main idea, finding meaning of words in context, passage comprehension, making logical inferences, etc.; **60 items 60 minutes**.
- **Vocabulary and General Knowledge** Contains vocabulary terms that are commonly used in both general English speaking settings and in health care fields; **50 items 50 minutes.**

#### Math:

• Math - Contains basic math, you will need to understand ratios, percentages, fractions, decimals, military time, roman numerals, and basic algebra. Other questions cover addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. There are also several measurement conversion questions. 50 items – 50 minutes.

#### Science:

Anatomy & Physiology - Provides coverage of general terminology and anatomical structures and systems;
 25 items – 25 minutes.

#### **Personality Style:**

- **Personality Profile** Uses concepts related to introversion and extroversion to classify a student's personality style; a print out with study tips is provided to the student; **25 items 15 minutes.**
- **Learning Style** Assesses the preferred learning style of the prospective applicant and offers test-taking and study tips suited to that learning style; **15 items 25 minutes**.
- **Critical Thinking**: This exam is a four-choice multiple-choice test. All answers are correct; however, each choice reflects a different degree of critical thinking. Scores range from 0-1000. The higher you score, the better the ability to think critically in the discipline of nursing.
